

## **Apply For CARES Act Funds**

Emergency financial aid grants are now available to students enrolled in fall 2020 classes. Even if you applied for CARES funding for spring 2020 or summer 2020, you are eligible to apply again for fall 2020 if you continue to experience financial hardship as a result of disruption due to COVID-19. These grants are intended to assist students in need and do not need to be repaid. Funds are limited and will be awarded on a first-come-first-served basis to eligible students. Answer: A drop is a procedure used to alter a class schedule after initial registration and through the last day to drop with a refund, as published in the Official College Calendar. A withdrawal from a course(s), within the published withdrawal period, results in a "W" grade, which is not computed in the GPA but counts as an attempt.
