Wednesday, Oct. 21st, is the last day to Add/Drop Courses, Change Credit/Audit for the Fall 2020 Mini-B Term. Please remember, any tuition and fees incurred by courses added after the Oct.1st Mini-B Term payment deadline must be made immediately upon registration. #### 2021-2022 FAFSA Application

You may be eligible to receive financial aid to help pay for college, but you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. The new 2021-22 FAFSA application is available **NOW!** You should fill it out as soon as possible at <u>FAFSA.gov</u> and use FSW school code 001477. Remember, a FAFSA needs to be completed every year to determine eligibility for grants, loans, work-study opportunities, and FSW scholarships.
